Thinking, and talking, about issues of sexuality and gender with our friends.

Session 03: Thinking and Talking about Homosexuality

KEY THOUGHT:

Any assertion people make must be backed up by a trustworthy (and relevant) source of information.

A little understood fact about Christians:

Christians simply aim to repeat the message of Jesus, as given to us through the writings of the New testament. For us, Jesus earned the right to tell us what the world really is, and how to live. Any authority lesser than his authority does not compete with his claim. If there's a conflict, he wins. We have no choice.

So, Followers of Jesus just ask, a simple questions: What does the bible (God) say about this issue? Then we just seek to understand, live out, and report what it says. Since what God says is true, and God is loving, this is the most loving thing we can do—and what God says is what will lead to the best for men and women. The fruit of our culture's ways, on the other hand, is self evident—how are we doing out there, with all these new ideas?

Once we have a sense of what Gender is, we have a context for talking about what sex is.

The thinking might go like this:

Knowing what a human is leads to...

Knowing what our bodies are for, which leads to...

Knowing what Gender is, which leads to...

Knowing what a Man (or a Woman) is, which leads to...

Knowing how man and woman are to relate to each other, which leads to...

Knowing what we're doing when we marry and have sex, which leads to...

Understanding what things would be good and right in terms of Sexual activity, and what things would not, which leads to...

Understanding the kinds of sexual activity that are prohibited in scripture.

The Main Texts for thinking about the issue:

- Genesis 1-3: Creation, Adam, and Eve
- Genesis 19: The City of Sodom
- Leviticus 18-22: The Holiness Code in the Law

The Main Texts for thinking about the issue:

- The Gospels: Jesus' teachings (For instance Mark 7:21-23)
- Paul's writings: Romans 1 and
 1 Corinthians 6:9-11

Several biblical texts show us that homosexual practice is sin.

...but... why would it be a sin?

This morning's question: Why would homosexual practice be wrong?

Answer:

Because we have a purpose...

Knowing God,

and ruling as a social community.

Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness..." ...So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. Then God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

Why would homosexual practice be wrong?

Because we have a purpose:

Knowing God, and ruling as a social community.

Purpose requires specialization.

Everything about us affects our ability to carry out our purpose: mental, emotional, physical.

In order to know God and care for creation in community, we have been made in a highly specialized way—physically, mentally, and emotionally.

Purpose requires specialization.

Humanity is precious.
Humanity is finely tuned.
Humanity is integrated.

Everything about us affects our ability to carry out our purpose: mental, emotional, physical.

Purpose requires specialization.

Relational issues are at the forefront of our ability to fulfill our purpose, because:

- 1. we know God most fully in community, and...
- 2. we require community to carry out the mandate to care for creation.

Issue of sexuality clearly affect all the areas of our being: mental, emotional, physical. Therefore they are of central importance.

They also affect our relationships in huge ways. Therefore...

Sexuality is important for the general mission and purpose of humanity.

It affects how we are able to know God.

It affects how we live relationally, in community.

So...these things matter so much because we matter so much, and because they uniquely affect us in a holistic way.


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
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


Talking Point: Let's Admit it...

Sex is not just physical. (We know it when we speak to young people.)

All the various layers of sexuality create dynamics that simply ruin many relationships.

(Think: Coach-Player, Boss-Employee, Teacher-Student, Parent-Child, Brother-Sister, etc...)

The best way for us to fulfill our purpose of living in community to know God and care for the earth.



Discussing this with non-Christian friends:

We have a fundamental disagreement about sexuality with our culture. Our culture has decided that most sexuality is healthy as long as it's consensual. We say: "On our own, we don't have the wisdom to know how to use sexuality on our own—we need the maker of sexuality to tell us."

Talking Point:

"I don't think I'm smart enough, by myself, to define something as powerful and essential as sex.

Talking Point:

And suggest something like this:

"In fact, isn't all this brokenness in our society that results from misuse of sexuality evidence that we don't know what we're doing? All I know is history has proven that the bible's directions for sex allow it to be a powerful, life-giving force for good in the world."

Discussing this with non-Christian friends:

Maybe discuss the Christian concept of sin—it cuts someone off from God, and injures any human involved.

Sin is sin partly (though not primarily) because of this damage it does to us in both of these directions.

We can say: "Sin hurts people. Always. Everyone..."

Discussing this with non-Christian friends:

All of this means that even though homosexuals say their sexuality is good and right, they are actually harming themselves, whether they know it or not — like a drug addict taking a hit.

So, it is loving for us to call our friends away from homosexual sexuality—because we're calling them away from something that is harming them.

The Bible.

What did Jesus say?

He told people they were generally pointed away from God, and called them to turn back to God.

See Matthew 4:17.

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From that time Jesus began to preach and to say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

"Repent" = "Reorient yourself towards God."

What did Jesus say?

He spoke about these things in a way appropriate to his (Jewish) context: he upheld the OT laws regarding purity, and addressed the issues of his day.

See Mark 7:17-23.

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He said, "What comes out of a man, that defiles a man. ²¹ For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders, ²² thefts, covetousness, wickedness, deceit, lewdness, an evil eye, blasphemy, pride, foolishness. ²³ All these evil things come from within and defile a man."

What about the rest of the NT?

When the Christian message moved outside of the context of Judea, they began mentioning these things explicitly.

See Romans 1:24-29.

See Romans 1:24-29.

God also gave them up to uncleanness, in the lusts of their hearts, to dishonor their bodies among themselves, ²⁵ who exchanged the truth of God for the lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen. ²⁶ For this reason God gave them up to vile passions. For even their women exchanged the natural use for what is against nature. ²⁷ Likewise also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman, burned in their lust for one another, men with men committing what is shameful, and receiving in themselves the penalty of their error which was due. ²⁸ And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a debased mind, to do those things which are not fitting...

What about the Old Testament? Do we cherry-pick verses?

No, we read the bible according to its self-described method of interpretation. Jesus fulfilled the whole OT law, and his teachings govern our life now.

What about the Old Testament? Do we cherry-pick verses?

Example: Christians don't offer sacrifices, because Jesus is our sacrifice. We know this because the NT teaches us to think this way. We resolve all issues of interpretation this way.

What about the OT?
Do we cherry-pick verses?

The bible must be read intelligently, on its own terms, taking the flow of the story into account, and then the reasons why Christians do or don't keep certain verses makes sense.

Orientation & Repentance

Jesus' message:

Everyone needs to repent. Everyone can repent.

God defines repentance. God enables repentance.

Then Jesus said to those Jews who believed Him, "If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed. And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free. They answered Him, "We are Abraham's descendants, and have never been in bondage to anyone. How can you say, 'You will be made free'? Jesus answered them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, whoever commits sin is a slave of sin... Therefore if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed.

John 8:31-36

Jesus answered and said to him, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." Nicodemus said to Him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear the sound of it, but cannot tell where it comes from and where it goes. So is everyone who is born of the Spirit.


